# ALPHABET SOUP:VTCI, CTCI, NTVT! WHO AM I?

Many of our newer members might be wondering about all these letters floating around recently. Let's talk some history! Our parent organization, The Vintage Thunderbird Club International (VTCI) formed in Tulsa, OK, over 57 years ago, where it was originally known as The Squarebird Society, focused on the 1958, 1959, and 1960 model years. Over the years, the club evolved into a world-wide organization which accepts all models of Thunderbirds (1955-2005) as members. VTCI promotes the preservation and enjoyment of all Thunderbirds and is made up of over 40 local chapter clubs. Those local clubs are clustered geographically into six US Regions: Northeast, Southeast, North Central, South Central, Northwest, and Southwest. Additionally, there are three Canadian Regions, Northeast, North Central, and Northwest. Our own North Texas Vintage Thunderbirds is one chapter of 6 included in the VTCI South Central Region.



The Classic Thunderbird Club International (CTCI) has a similar long history having been in existence over 50 years. Currently, CTCI has over 5,000 members in 121 local chapters throughout the US and the world. Their organization is focused primarily on two-seater Thunderbirds, which for many years were limited to the "Early Birds" from 1955, 1956, & 1957.

Recently, their organization began accepting the Retro Birds from 2002-2005.

One thing both organizations have in common is a desire to help people understand and care for their classic Thunderbirds. One method of doing that has been through hosting International Conventions where Tbird owners can have their vehicles undergo Concours Judging, where the cars are judged according to original factory specifications. The VTCI also has oth-

er judging categories owners might choose such as touring, modified, driver, or display; in those, judging criteria are not as stringent as the Concours Judging. A complete discussion of the various judging categories for VTCI can be found on their website: https://vintagethunderbirdclub.net/

While the history of these automotive clubs might be

interesting, the real impact of being a member can only be experienced in the present. Being a VTCI member offers extensive tech support and historical documentation through an excellent website, a Facebook page, and an opportunity to purchase merchandise through the "Country Store" on the VTCI website. Members also receive The Thunderbird Scoop, which provides color pictures and articles focusing on the owning, restoring, and maintaining these classic cars. But the VTCI membership applications says it best: The most important of all benefits is the opportunity to meet and build friendships with some of the most wonderful people "Unique in all the World"—our members.



## Combined VTCI/CTCI Convention

If you are new to NTVT, or just have never attended a VTCI convention, you may be wondering what all the excitement is about regarding attending the combined CTCI/VTCI International Convention being held in Grapevine Sept 10-13. First and foremost, conventions are fun! The VTCI Convention Committee, under the direction of our South Central Regional Director, Brian Carron, is expecting over 100 cars entered on the judging field; and, that in itself, is something spectacular to see. In addition, you will meet the most interesting and sociable people from all over the US and Canada! You make new friends, and get reacquainted with old friends. Also, the tours and activities are outstanding. You can choose to tour AT&T Stadium, the George W Bush Library, and/or The Dallas Aboretum. There will also be a driving tour to the Sam Pack Automotive Museum, followed by lunch and a tour of the Amos Minter Restoration Facility. There is a possibility you will have the chance to take your Tbird up to the Texas Motor Speedway for a spin on the track! You can find all the details on the registration forms must be downloaded and printed, filled out by hand, and sent in via mail. The cut-off for registration by mail is August 12, 2025.

As a side note, on that website, you will note that there are separate registration forms for members and non-members. If you are not currently a VTCI member, your registration fee will be slightly higher than members. Due to insurance regulations, all participants of the convention must be members of VTCI at the time of the convention. The fee you pay to register as a non-member is \$60, and that gets you membership in VTCI for 16 months beginning in September.

It is important to register for the convention and book your hotel rooms soon so that plans can be made for the tours, transportation, purchase of shirts, etc. We will be staying at the Embassy Suites North Grapevine Hotel, near the Bass Pro Shop. Call the hotel directly at 972-724-2600 to book your rooms; be sure to mention the "All Thunderbird Convention" and the group code "C90E" to make the reservation at the special rate. As of the latest information, 70 of the 85 rooms set aside for convention have been booked, so get your reservations made soon, or you might find yourself having to book an overflow hotel. You can decide if you want to spend all the nights at the convention or just one or two. I can tell you, however, that staying at the hotel is so much fun, and really makes the convention experience spectacular!

Each registration will come with a "goodie" bag with an assortment of items. If you own a business or know of a business that might like the opportunity to advertise by donating items for the bags, be sure to let Brian Carron or Brad Kershaw know as soon as possible. Businesses can also advertise in the Convention Booklet; these donations and advertisements help defray the costs of the convention.

A silent auction will be held at the convention. If you have new or desirable used items that might appeal to people, please consider donating them to the silent auction. You will

need to submit a form ahead of time to let the organizers know how many items to expect. You can find this form attached to the email delivering this newsletter, or ask for a printed form at the February meeting. You can specify an opening bid (minimum price) on the form, but be aware that if it doesn't sell for that price, you will need to pick the item up at the close of the auction. Mail printed submission forms to Vintage Thunderbird Club International, Inc. P.O. Box 75308 Wichita, KS 67275. You can also email the submission form information directly to vtcicountrystore@gmail.com including a picture and/or a detailed description of the item. Silent auction items can be nearly anything!

One of the traditional aspects of a Convention is the Concours judging. You can choose to have your car judged in one of several categories, or you can choose to simply put it on display, where it is eligible for a People's Choice Award only. The Concours judging sheets are very detailed, and you can learn exactly what improvements you need to make to your car if you want it to become a #1 car. Brian has asked for volunteers who will be trained as judges, so that judging will be fair. Judging of the VTCI and CTCI cars will be conducted separately.

Volunteers really have the opportunity to make the convention fun for everyone. All kinds of volunteer positions are open, from serving as tour hosts to staffing the hospitality room, to running tally sheets for the judging. There is something for everyone to do. See the Volunteer Sign-Up Sheet attached to the email delivering this newsletter.

Although the Convention begins on September 9th, with the registration desk open that day, there are no planned activities. On Wednesday, 9/10, the major activity is the AT&T tour in the afternoon. On Thursday, things begin ramping up starting with the Board of Directors' meeting and General Meeting of the Membership at 9 a.m. Judges Training sessions will follow. There are two choices offered Thursday afternoon: going to the TX Motor Speedway or touring the George W Bush Presidential Library in Dallas. Judging happens on Friday, with Judges and Owners meetings beginning at 8 a.m.; VTCI Concours Judging begins at 9:30. For those attendees who are not involved in the judging, there is a tour to the Dallas Arboretum at 10 a.m. That evening, there is a buffet dinner/cash bar with entertainment following. Saturday starts with the Swap Meet opening at 7 a.m., At 10 a.m., you can go on a free friving tour to the Sam Pack Automotive Facility followed by lunch and a tour of the Amos Minter Restoration facility; or you can tour historic Grapevine on your own (free shuttles available). Saturday evening, the convention wraps up with the awards banquet.

#### How can you help make this convention an unforgettable event?

- Register and plan to attend the convention for as much of it as you can.
- Volunteer to serve in some way.
- Donate items for the goodie bags or the silent auction
- Bring items for the Saturday morning Swap Meet.

March Elections & Officer Changes


Elections for our 2025 slate of officers will be held at the March meeting at the Real Texas Café in Euless. Watch your email around March 7th, for directions and a chance to RSVP.

According to our revised bylaws, the NTVT Board is made up of: the President, who presides over meetings and handles any communication/business with our parent club, VTCI; the 1st VP (assists the President and assumes his or her duties in the absence of the President, assists monthly hosts/troubleshoots events, ensures there are door prizes at each meeting); the 2nd VP (receives new membership applications, and helps new members integrate into the club); the Secretary who takes minutes at monthly meetings; the Treasurer; the Newsletter Editor; and the Past President. Our club uses the rotating leadership model, whereby each year we elect one officer, the 2nd VP over membership). Each year, the person holding the office of 2nd VP advances to 1st VP; and the 1st VP advances to President. This allows individuals to grow through participating in leadership for three years, something that gives our club consistency while allowing for "new blood" on the Board. The remaining offices (Secretary, Treasurer, Newsletter Editor) are filled upon resignation of the person holding the office or someone wants to run against the incumbent; there is no term limit for those offices.

It is a privilege to serve as an officer. If you would like to nominate yourself, PLEASE contact any of the current officers to get your name on the ballot. This year, we have had one nomination so far for 1st VP; to date, nobody has nominated themselves for 2nd VP. If you are interested in either of these positions, the deadline for getting your name on the ballot is March 1st.
