
Thanks to all the club members for all of the support you have shown me during the past year.

This year's feature will be vehicles powered by the Ford flathead V8, introduced in 1932. The theme for this year's classic has yet to be decided upon.

Elections in March

The annual officer elections are coming up in March. The board, made up of the current officers and the past president, will present a ballot for the members at the March meeting to vote on.

Historically, the first twenty years of NTVT were under the leadership of some long-term officers. While lengthy terms of experienced people can be good for stability, we all know clubs where one person who stays in leadership for a very long time can lead to stagnation and loss of participation. It's good for clubs to have fresh ideas and new leadership. About 15 years ago or so, the board at that time decided to examine the bylaws of the club and suggest some changes that might have a positive effect on the club.

That was when our rotating leadership got its start. Each year, instead of voting in all new officers, we now elect one new officer...the 2nd Vice President who will be in charge of receiving new members, most of whom come from inquiries to our website. Then the current 2nd VP "graduates" to the position of 1st VP, who is in charge of events, making sure someone makes the reservations and follows up on the details of filling the calendar of events set by the board. And the current 1st VP moves up to fill the spot of the President, who runs the meetings and is listed in the Scoop as the contact person for our chapter. The Past President then continues on the board as an advisor for the next year. This system helps new people get involved while building a level of experience and proficiency as each officer moves upward. The other officer positions (secretary and treasurer) are allowed to stay in their positions as long as they are interested. If a member would like to run for an open position, they can self-nominate by contacting any officer.

We hope this explanation will help new members understand how the club leadership rotates and hopefully best serves the needs of the club.
